

Predisan's work—to provide holistic health and community service to Catacamas and surrounding areas in Olancho, Honduras—continues to be blessed. More people are being helped and treated than ever before—a 107 percent growth in the past seven years.

Predisan's medical staff, volunteers and health promoters operate the Healthy Communities program out of six primary health centers, one urban and five rural. In addition, The Good Samaritan Medical Center provides specialty care doctors, nurses and therapists. Those struggling with addiction seek inpatient and outpatient help at The Center for Rehabilitation of Addictions (CEREPA).

The Spiritual Development staff integrates their services throughout all our programs, offering individual and group bible study activities for patients, staff, visitors and community members, which transform lives.

CEREPA: THE CENTER FOR THE REHABILITAION OF PEOPLE WITH ADDICTIONS

Like too many young people, influenced by his peers, Oliver started using drugs when he was 12 years old. Many times he has tried to stop only to return to them. Last year, as a young adult, he found himself intoxicated, out of work, out of money and malnourished. He reached out to his father for help. His father had heard of CEREPA and sought help for Oliver there.

CEREPA offered Oliver hope. At first Oliver struggled to participate in the programs and therapy that was provided. Oliver says, "I learned so much at CEREPA. It has been very hard . . . I now have strong Faith that with God's help, everything is possible." Now that Oliver is sober and has hope, he is planning for his future.
