



Dear Friends,

Predisan family wish you and your and families a very Merry Christmas and New Year season. We have so much hope that during 2021 we shall hug again and serve together in God's work through mission Predisan in Honduras.

The main purpose of this letter is to give you an update on the current situation for our upcoming groups and brigades.

According to the Honduran Civil Aeronautics Agency, after the passage of Hurricane ETA and the tropical storm IOTA in Honduras, the Ramón Villeda Morales International Airport in San Pedro Sula was flooded and will be inactive until January 2021. However, the commercial and international flights are active at the Toncontin International Airport from Tegucigalpa, which is the one we always use to receive groups and brigades.

As far as we know, it is possible to have groups and individuals coming in the next month of January 2021, and as we mentioned in the previous letter, we already received two volunteers in August and one patient in October, who had no problem at the airport entrance.

Every passenger who enters the national territory must present a negative result of the Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test in real time or rapid test for COVID-19, performed within the last seventy-two (72) hours, before entering the country, in fortuitous cases or evidence symptoms, the passenger must undergo a clinical evaluation by the staff of the International Health Office (OSI).

If you want more specific updates we can schedule a zoom call with you. In the meantime, let's continue praying for each other without ceasing during this pandemic situation.
