We also rejoice that more women are embracing our inpatient program, finding healing from the wounds addiction has inflicted on themselves and their families.

And those families matter deeply. They are a vital factor in our patients' lasting sobriety, which is why we praise God that over 600 online family therapy sessions were conducted in 2025!

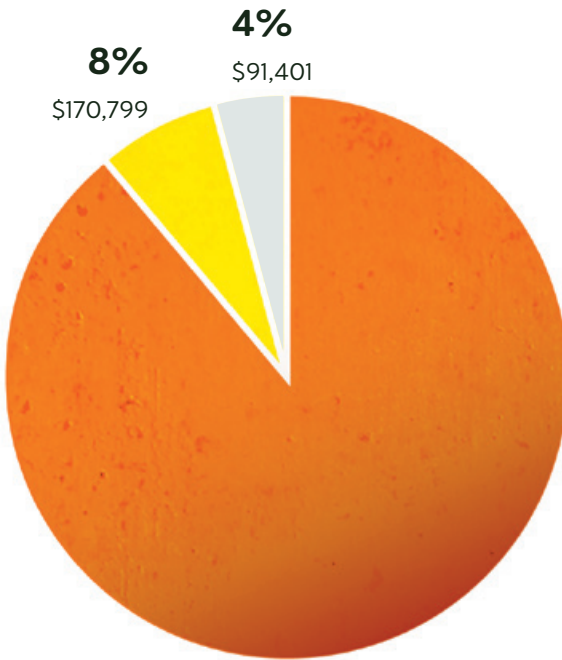

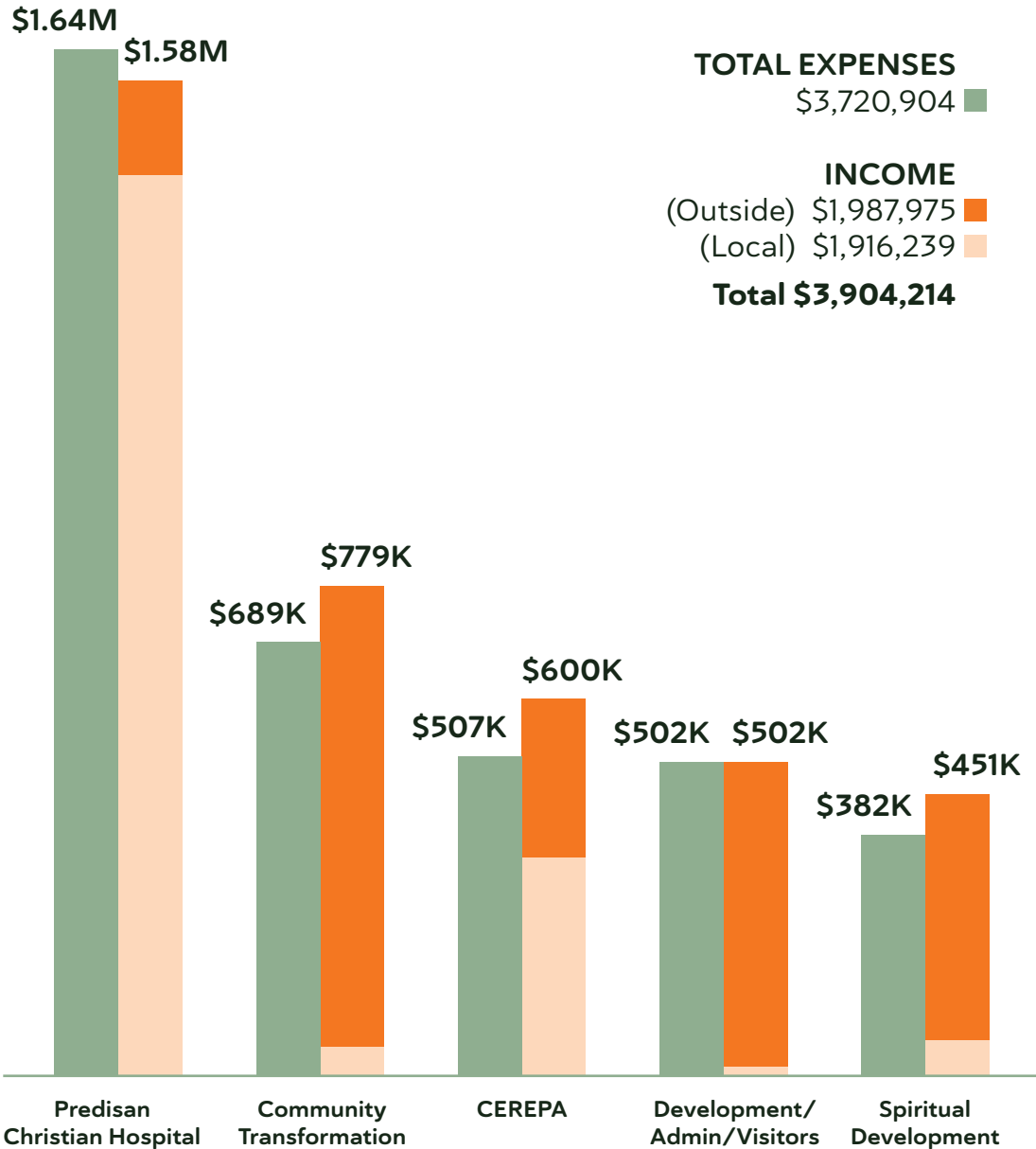

THE CLARK & MADRID FAMILIES ENDOWMENT FUND

Disciplined organizations maintain a steadfast focus on their mission while actively preparing for the future. With this in mind, Predisan established an endowment in 2006 to build long-term strength and stability — and to give faithful donors a way to play a perpetual role in the work of Predisan.

The Clark & Madrid Families Endowment Fund honors our founding missionaries and our founding medical director and CEO, and is professionally managed following endowment best practices. Assets are allocated with 70% invested in equities and 30% in cash and fixed income. Each year, the board, key staff, and the endowment committee award a portion of the endowment balance to fund projects that are key to Predisan's mission.

2025 ENDOWMENT DISTRIBUTION



In 2025, the endowment distribution of \$27,300 supported three key needs:

Elder Healthcare Subsidy (\$15,680)

Many elderly patients cannot afford chronic disease management and medications. This subsidy ensured they received dignified, necessary care.

High-Flow Oxygen System (\$7,050)

Purchased for Predisan Christian Hospital, this equipment improved

patient safety, enhanced outcomes, and reduced costly patient transfers.

Sunday School Children's Program (\$4,570)

This program provided weekly meals, mentorship, medical and dental care, and Bible study to 37 economically vulnerable children.
